A document designed to inform Local Authority's Children's Services policy teams about **commissioning** information, advice and guidance is available. It discusses delivery via Children's Trusts, 14 - 19 Strategy Groups and individual institutions and examines those activities, programmes and processes that support the choices made by young people. Positive activities

From Monday, 8 January all local authorities are expected to secure access for young people to 'positive activities' including youth clubs, sports facilities and art projects; to take account of young people's views on the activities and facilities currently available to them, as well as any new ones they would like to see in the area; and to publicise these to young people, and keep the information up-to-date. The Statutory Guidance related to Section 6 of the Education and Inspections Act, around positive activities, has been launched for consultation.
